How to Use This Document

Overview

This bundle contains the complete uploaded medical records, continuously paginated and organised using AI analysis. Every constituent document (letters, reports, result sheets, record sections) is identified and listed in the Table of Contents under its ORIGINATING provider — the trust, department or practice that authored it — so secondary-care letters held in a GP file appear under their own NHS trust. Confidence Levels

Each document in the Table of Contents has four confidence scores indicating how certain the system is about different aspects — and unlike self-reported AI scores, these are checked mechanically against the source text wherever possible:

Boundary Confidence	How confident the system is that the document starts and ends at the identified pages. High means the document's opening header was verified verbatim on its first page.
Date Confidence	How certain the extracted date of service is. High means the date parses to a real calendar date taken from the record.
Provider Confidence	Which healthcare organisation the document came from. High is awarded only when the provider named is found in the page text by an automated check.
Category Confidence	How certain the document-type classification is (e.g. Correspondence, Results & Reports, Radiology / Imaging). High means it matches a standard record class.

A document marked **[!] possible third-party** carries identifiers that appear to belong to a different patient (a letter misfiled within these records) — verify it before relying on it and notify the records provider. Dates on scanned pages are read by dual-pass OCR; a date the two passes disagreed on, or one that fails a sanity check, is shown blank rather than guessed.

Confidence Values

High	Strong, machine-verified evidence supports this determination.
Medium	Reasonable evidence, but some uncertainty exists.

Bundle Types

Documents are grouped into bundles by their ORIGINATING clinical provider — resolved from each document's own letterhead and signature block, not from the file it arrived in — so hospital letters held in a GP file are listed under their NHS trust. The Records section and Detailed Index preserve the original upload order as an audit trail.
